STRATEGIC PLAN: IMPROVE AND EXPAND STUDENT SERVICES

Request For Proposals No. 028-GG10 - OUTSIDE AGENCIES QUALIFIED TO OPERATE ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAMS FOR MIAMI-DADE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS AT-RISK STUDENTS, which opened on March 22, 2007, is to provide educational services to children at-risk and/or adjudicated youth for grades 6-12, within Miami-Dade County, Florida, for the Office of Special Programs, Alternative Outreach and Psychological Services. This is a term proposal. Eight (8) vendors responded to this advertised solicitation.

A meeting of the Selection Committee to evaluate the proposals was held on March 30, 2007. Eight proposals were presented for consideration: Cuban American National Council, Inc.; Dade Marine Institutes; Lincoln-Marti Community Agency, Inc.; Metro-Miami Action Plan Trust; Ombudsman Educational Services, Ltd; James E. Scott Community Association (JESCA); Richmond-Perrine Optimist Club, Inc.; and Recapturing the Vision International, Inc. After considerable discussion, the Committee unanimously recommended that all agencies that submitted a proposal be considered for award.

Subsequent to the Selection Committee's recommendation, JESCA submitted its year-end audited financial statement, pursuant to Contract No. 029-FF10, one month late. JESCA's independent auditors identified material weaknesses in the organization's financial reporting. As a result, the Superintendent is not recommending a contract award to JESCA under RFP No. 028-GG10.

The contracted amounts to be awarded to each agency are based on the 2006-2007 revenue per FTE allocation and include summer school. These figures are subject to change, once the State Legislature finalizes the state budget for the next fiscal year. Contracts will be adjusted accordingly, if necessary. The total amount awarded includes students being reassigned from JESCA to other awarded agencies.
