### INSTRUCTIONS TO AGENCY/PROPOSER SUBMITTING PROPOSAL

### I. PREPARING OF PROPOSALS

- A. THE PROPOSAL IS TO BE SUBMITTED, using 8-1/2" x 11" paper.
- B. IDENTIFICATION. Failure to indicate the contractor's EXACT legal name and an unsigned proposal may be considered non-responsive.

#### II. SUBMITTING OF PROPOSALS

A. Number of Proposals:

A total of (12) copies of the Proposal must be submitted as follows:

- \* The original proposal in a sealed envelope or box marked "Original."
- \*\* (11) copies of the proposal in a separate sealed envelope or box marked "Copies."

The proposal number, proposal title and opening date must be clearly marked on all envelopes and boxes.

B. Place, Date and Hour. Proposals shall be submitted to The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, Procurement Management, Room 352, 1450 N.E. 2nd Avenue, Miami, Florida, not later than 2:00 P.M. April 13, 2006.

#### III. CHANGE OR WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSAL

- A. PRIOR TO PROPOSAL OPENING. Should the agency or individual contractor withdraw its proposal, they shall do so in writing. This communication is to be received by the Assistant Superintendent, Procurement Management Services, 1450 N.E. 2nd Avenue, prior to April 13, 2006. The agency or individual contractor's name and the proposal number should appear on the envelope.
- B. AFTER PROPOSAL OPENING. After April 13, 2006, proposals may not be changed; and they may not be withdrawn for one hundred twenty (120) days from that date.

# IV. PROTEST TO CONTRACT SOLICITATION OR AWARD

A. The Board shall provide notice of a decision or intended decision concerning a solicitation, contract award, or exceptional purchase by electronic posting. This notice shall contain the following statement:

"Failure to file a protest within the time prescribed in Section 120.57(3), Florida Statutes, shall constitute a waiver of proceedings under Chapter 120, Florida Statutes."

- B. Any person who is adversely affected by the agency decision or intended decision, shall file with the agency a notice of protest in writing within 72 hours after the posting of the notice of decision or intended decision. With respect to a protest of the terms, conditions, and specifications contained in a solicitation, including any provisions governing the methods of ranking proposals or replies, awarding contracts, reserving rights of further negotiation or modifying or amending any contract, the notice of protest shall be filed in writing within 72 hours after the posting of the solicitation. The formal written protest shall be filed within 10 days after the date of the notice of protest is filed. Failure to file a notice of protest or failure to file a formal written protest shall constitute a waiver of proceedings. The formal written protest shall state with particularity the facts and law upon which the protest is based. Saturdays, Sundays, and state holidays shall be excluded in the computation of the 72-hour time periods provided by this paragraph.
  - C. The notice of protest will be reviewed by Procurement Services staff, which will offer the protesting proposer the opportunity to meet and discuss the merits of the protest. If the protest if not resolved, the proposer may seek an administrative hearing pursuant to 120.57 Florida Statutes, by filing a formal written protest within 10 days after filing the notice of protest. Petitions for hearings on protests pursuant to 120.57 Florida Statutes must be filed in accordance with School Board Rule 6Gx13-8C-1064.

#### V. AWARDS

- A. RESERVATION FOR REJECTION OR AWARD. The Board reserves the right to reject any and all proposals, to waive irregularities or technicalities, and to request re-bids.
- B. NOTIFICATION OF INTENDED ACTION. Notices will be posted on the District's website 7-10 days prior to a regularly scheduled Board meeting.
- C. OFFICIAL AWARD DATE. Awards become official upon Board action.
- D. CHARTER SCHOOLS: Items awarded under this contract shall be made

available to charter schools authorized by the School Board.

### VI. DEFAULT

In the event of default, which may include, but is not limited to non-performance and/or poor performance, the awardee shall lose eligibility to transact new business with the Board for a period of 14 months from date of termination of award by the Board. Proposers that are determined ineligible may request a hearing pursuant to §120.569, Fla. Stat., and School Board Rule 6Gx13-8C-1.064.

### VII. PUBLIC ENTITY CRIMES

Section 287.133(2)(a) Florida Statute. A person or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime may not submit a bid on a contract to provide any goods or services to a public entity, may not submit a bid on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work, may not submit bids on leases of real property to a public subcontractor, or consultant under a contract with any public entity, and may not transact business with any public entity in excess of the threshold amount provided in Section 287.017, for CATEGORY TWO for a period of 36 months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list.

#### VIII. COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL REGULATIONS

All contracts involving Federal funds will contain certain provisions required by applicable sections of Title 34, Section 80.36(I) and Section 85.510 Code of Federal Regulations and are included by reference herein. The vendor certifies by signing the proposal that the vendor and its principals are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from participation in Federally funded transactions and may, in certain instances, be required to provide a separate written certification to this effect.

During the term of any contract with the Board, in the event of debarment, suspension, proposed debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from participation in Federally funded transactions, the vendor shall immediately notify the Assistant Superintendent, Procurement Management Services, in writing.

Vendors will also be required to provide access to records, which are directly pertinent to the contract and retain all required records for three years after the grantee (The Board) or sub-grantee makes final payment.

For all contracts involving Federal funds, in excess of \$10,000, The Board reserves the right to terminate the contract for cause as well as for convenience by issuing a certified notice to the vendor.

# IX. CONE OF SILENCE BOARD RULE 6GX13-8C-1.212

# **DEFINITION:**

- A. "Cone of Silence" means a prohibition on any communication regarding a particular Request for Proposals (RFP), bid, or other competitive solicitation between:
  - 1. any person who seeks an award therefrom, including a potential vendor or vendor's representative; and
  - any School Board member or the member's staff, the Superintendent, Deputy Superintendent and their respective support staff, or any person appointed by the School Board to evaluate or recommend selection in such procurement process.

The Cone of Silence shall not apply to communication with the School Board Attorney or his or her staff, or with designated school district staff, who are not serving on the particular Procurement Committee, to obtain clarification or information concerning the subject solicitation. For purposes of this section, "vendor's representative" means an employee, partner, director, or officer of a potential vendor, or consultant, lobbyist, or actual or potential subcontractor or subconsultant of a vendor, or any other individual acting through or on behalf of any person seeking an award.

- B. A Cone of Silence shall be applicable to each RFP, bid, or other competitive solicitation during the solicitation and review of bid proposals. At the time of issuance of the solicitation, the Superintendent or the Superintendent's designee shall provide public notice of the Cone of Silence. The Superintendent shall include in any advertisement and public solicitation for goods and services a statement disclosing the requirements of this section.
- C. The Cone of Silence shall terminate at the time the Superintendent of Schools submits a written recommendation to award or approve a contract, to reject all bids or responses, or otherwise takes action which ends the solicitation and review process.
- D. Nothing contained herein shall prohibit any potential vendor or vendor's representative:

- from making public representations at duly noticed pre-bid conferences or before duly noticed selection and negotiation committee meetings;
- from engaging in contract negotiations during any duly noticed public meeting;
- from making a public presentation to the School Board during any duly noticed public meeting; or
- from communicating in writing with any school district employee or official for purposes of seeking clarification or additional information, subject to the provisions of the applicable RFP, or bid documents.

The potential vendor or vendor's representative shall file a copy of any written communication with the School Board Clerk who shall make copies available to the public upon request.

- E. Nothing contained herein shall prohibit the Procurement Committee's representative from initiating contact with a potential vendor or vendor's representative and subsequent communication related thereto for the purposes of obtaining further clarifying information regarding a response to an RFP, or competitive solicitation. Such contact shall be in writing and shall be provided to the members of the applicable Procurement Committee, including any response thereto.
- F. Any violation of this rule shall be investigated by the School Board's Inspector General and may result in any recommendation for award, or any RFP award, or bid award to said potential vendor or vendor's representative being deemed void or voidable. The potential vendor or vendor's representative determined to have violated this rule, shall be subject to debarment. In addition to any other penalty provided by law, violation of this rule by a school district employee shall subject the employee to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal.

#### I. NAME AND ADDRESS OF REQUESTER

# II. PURPOSE OF REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

The purpose of this Request For Proposals (RFP) is to select a proposer to enter into a contract with Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) for exclusive beverage pouring rights for the vending program at all district school sites and facilities. The Board is seeking a program that will generate additional revenues. The proposer selected will have exclusive rights for all beverage products included in this proposal. For the student access areas within the school sites, the products shall include, milk-based products and other non-milk-based products, pursuant to the Healthy Beverages and Food Guidelines outlined in **Attachment A**. This proposal pertains to the purchase of, and pouring rights for, beverages only. Vending machine equipment is not included as a part of this proposal for the student access areas. Vending machine equipment, shall, however, be provided exclusively by the proposer as part of this contract, for the non-student access areas with the District.

Exclusive pouring rights will include beverages stocked in machines located in student access areas, teacher lounges, athletic areas, gymnasiums, and administrative offices district-wide. M-DCPS will be operating a self-vending program for the student access sites and will be responsible for stocking of the exclusive beverage products to be sold.

### III. INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMISSION OF PROPOSALS

Twelve copies of the proposal, one of which shall be an original, must be received by 2:00 p.m. (Eastern Standard Time) April 13, 2006, at:

The School Board of Miami Dade County, Florida Bid Clerk, Division of Procurement Management Services 1450 Northeast Second Avenue, Room 352 Miami, Florida 33132 The responsibility for submitting this proposal to the District on or before the stated time and date will be solely and strictly the responsibility of the Proposer. The District will not be responsible for delays caused by the United States Post Office or any other delivery service or for delays resulting from any other occurrence. The proposal must be submitted in a sealed envelope or box marked "EXCLUSIVE BEVERAGE POURING RIGHTS FOR MIAMI-DADE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS VENDING PROGRAM."

It is anticipated that a proposal may be presented to The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, for acceptance on or about May 10, 2006. In the event that the proposal is accepted, notice to the successful proposer(s) will be sent on or about May 10, 2006. The Board reserves the right to accept or reject any and all proposals.

# IV. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The school district of Miami-Dade County, Florida, is the fourth largest school system in the nation. The district has approximately 340 schools, charter schools, alternative schools, and exceptional student education centers; approximately 363,288 students and more than 57,372 full and part-time employees. The student population is economically, ethnically, and linguistically diverse, with the largest ethnic group being Hispanic students.

In response to the growing concerns regarding childhood obesity and other serious health related issues, the School Board of Miami-Dade County Public Schools has initiated a Health and Wellness Policy effective July 1, 2006 for all food and beverage sales before, during and 1 hour after school. The board is committed to providing an environment in which all students can make healthy food choices for lifelong health and possible prevention of future adult type illnesses related to unhealthy choices made as a child.

# V. SCOPE OF SERVICES

The purpose of this Request For Proposals (RFP) is to obtain revenue for the exclusive beverage pouring rights of stated products in the district's vending program. Any beverage meeting the nutritional guidelines as defined in the district's Health and Wellness Policy, shall be approved for sale in the student access areas covered under the District's self-vending program. (Attachment A). There are no restrictions for beverages sold in non-student access areas. Proposers may submit a proposal for exclusive pouring rights on Milk-Based beverages only; Non-Milk Based beverages only or a combination of both, as there will be both types of products sold in the District's student access self-vending program. Non-student access sites may stock any item agreed upon by the site administrator. Proposer must state with specificity products offered in clear and concise terms to be considered.

# Areas Defined for Exclusive Pouring Rights

- All vending machines at <u>student access sites</u> ie; senior high schools, middle schools, vocational sites and all miscellaneous sites where students have access to vending machines. (Attachment B).
- All vending machines located in <u>non-student access</u> sites such as administrative offices/areas, transportation offices/areas, maintenance offices/areas, construction offices, etc., inclusive of teacher lounges.

# Vending Responsibilities for Student Access Sites

- The <u>student access sites</u> self-vending program will be fully operated by the
  Department of Food and Nutrition or its sub-contractor. The successful exclusive
  beverage proposer will not be involved with any aspect of the vending operation of
  student access sites, except the exclusive right to have beverage products sold in
  the vending machines.
- The Student Access self-vending program is committed to only selling the successful proposer's products in the vending machines, provided the product meets the nutritional guidelines outlined.
- The Student Access sites where there is counter service, which is defined as any non-vended point of sale, other than reimbursable meals vending machines, may also use the products offered by the exclusive beverage proposer, if desired.

# Vending Responsibilities for Non-Student Access Sites

- The Non-Student Access sites may stock any beverage items, proposed under this
  exclusivity contract, in the vending machines, as designated by the site
  administrator or designee.
- Successful proposer shall arrange with the site administrator or designee any and all vending products to be sold. The Department of Food and Nutrition will not be involved in any way with the daily operation of these vended sites.
- Awarded proposer must contact each non-student access site and make arrangements for vending machine implementation and operation.
- Awarded proposer must guarantee that each site receive a minimum of 25% commission from each machine installed.
- Awarded proposer may sub-contract vending services for the non-student access sites provided they meet the proposer requirements approved by the district. The sub-contractor must follow all board rules and regulations that govern doing business with Miami-Dade County Public Schools.

- The proposer must keep all machines in good working order, clean and presentable as determined by the site administrator or designee.
- The proposer or its sub-contractor must provide a method to verify each sale in each machine and price charged per item. The price per item must be reasonable and agreed upon by the site administrator or designee and the awarded proposer prior to installation.
- The district is not responsible for any vandalism, theft or damage to vending machines placed at non-student access sites.
- Non-student access sites may arrange with awarded proposer or its sub-contractor to provide snack vending machines using the same operational guidelines.
- Awarded proposer shall provide energy efficient machines with the "energy star" label or equivalent for each vending machine. Proposer may attach an energy saving device and document provided before installation. Any energy device will be installed at the proposer's expense.

# Marketing Incentive

- The awarded proposer will have the sole, exclusive rights to place any
  advertising on the front, back or side panels of the enclosures and of the
  vending machines located at student access sites operated under the District's
  self-vending program, with the final written approval by the Department of Food
  and Nutrition. Non-student access sites must have the approval of the site
  administrator.
- Awarded proposer must provide all necessary equipment, attachments, adhesive, or other type of parts components needed to attach advertising to enclosures and or machines.
- Upon termination of the contract, the awarded proposer must remove all advertising and signage and ensure machines and enclosures are restored to original condition.
- Awarded proposer must adhere to District guidelines as pertains to signage, which prohibits offensive or tasteless language or pictures. Brand type signage is acceptable but must display items within the perimeter of healthy choices at student-access areas.
- All signage must have the final approval of the Administrative Designee from the Department of Food and Nutrition for student access sites.
- Awarded proposer may provide additional marketing material, i.e. shirts, cups, lunch boxes, etc, All items must be approved by the administrative designee at the Department of Food and Nutrition by submitting a sample of one item with all pertinent information, quantities, method of distribution, amounts, etc. No items will be permitted to be distributed without prior approval by the Department of Food and Nutrition for student access areas.

# Delivery, Installation, Service and Repair- Non-Student Access Sites

 Successful proposers will provide all direct delivery of vending machine equipment to specified non-student access sites.

- Proposer shall install enclosures and attach to concrete or base as, if required.
- Proposer shall maintain the equipment in good repair, condition and working order and shall furnish all parts, mechanisms and devices required to keep the equipment in good working order.
- Response time for repairs shall be as soon as possible, but no more than two (2)
  work days after notification via telephone/fax or by other communication means
  acceptable to both parties.
- Proposer shall provide toll free dedicated phone numbers and e-mail addresses to enable sites to make immediate contact.
- Proposer shall assume the risk of loss and damage to the vending equipment from malicious or intentional acts by others. Proposers shall repair or replace vending equipment/enclosures with similar equipment. Proposer shall repair and/or replace all equipment/enclosures, due to natural disasters such as hurricane, floods, windstorms or any other similar acts.
- Proposer shall provide "loaner" equipment should any machine or enclosures be deemed unusable or non-repairable for more than two (2) workdays.
- Initial delivery and implementation shall be mutually agreed upon with district administrative designee and the successful proposer.
- All servicing of equipment shall take place during normal school hours unless otherwise instructed by the site administrator. Each service call must be logged in with the front office of each site unless otherwise instructed.
- During the performance of service at any school location, the Contractor and all
  personnel employed by the Contractor shall adhere to the following procedure
  during the service call: All service staff must have a picture identification card
  with employee photograph and company name, which must be worn at all times
  while on M-DCPS property. Other forms of picture identification, such as driver's
  license, are not acceptable. All service staff must be appropriately dressed, with
  clothing that does not contain any offensive or tasteless language or pictures. In
  addition, the service staff is strictly forbidden from engaging in interaction with
  students of M-DCPS.
- Proposer or its subcontractor shall follow all rules and regulations pertaining to safe driving on school grounds and surrounding neighborhoods, particularly when students are present.

# LOCATION/REMOVAL AND ADDITION OF VENDING MACHINES- NON-STUDENT ACCESS SITES

The District reserves the right to increase or decrease the number and/or type of machines at each location. No equipment shall be added or removed by the contractor without prior written approval of the Site Administrator or his/her authorized designee.

The site administrator and contractor shall work together to determine the optimum number of vending machines that need to be placed on campus or other locations to maximize sales and also minimize the Contractor's equipment investment.

At the time of expiration or termination of contract, the Contractor shall remove all vending machines installed by its company, without damage to the building and property, within

thirty (30) days of request and shall restore in good order and condition those areas utilized for these operations. This removal shall be at not cost to the District.

# **REFUNDS**

The Contractor shall establish a method to refund vending customers, who do not receive satisfactory products or their money back from vending machines. The Contractor shall provide each location a method to account for any refunds.

# INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR - NON STUDENT ACCESS SITES

The Contractor represents that it is fully experienced and properly qualified to perform the services required for the Contract and that it is properly licensed, equipped, organized, and financed to perform the services. The Contractor shall be an independent Contractor. The Contractor is not an agent of the District in the performance of the Contract, and shall maintain complete control over its employees and its subcontractors and suppliers of any tier. Nothing contained in the Contract or any subcontract awarded by the Contractor shall create any contractual relationship between any subcontractor and the District. The Contractor shall perform the services in accordance with its own methods, in compliance with the terms of the Contract.

The District reserves the right of prior approval of all subcontractors and retains the right to request Contractor to terminate any subcontractor, for any reason deemed appropriate by the District, by so notifying Contractor in writing. Should said notification be submitted to Contractor, it shall terminate said subcontractor immediately.

# VEHICLE SAFETY AND SECURITY

It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to ascertain the site location under whose direction the service shall be performed. The rules and regulations pertaining to safe driving on school grounds, and surrounding neighborhoods particularly when students and children are present, must be adhered to. The Contractor's drivers shall exercise extreme caution at all times and be sensitive to community concerns regarding excessive noise.

Drivers entering school premises when school is not in session shall lock any gate or door to which they have access, both when entering and/or leaving the grounds. Gate keys, as may be required, will be furnished by the site administrator supervising the service. Any unusual condition noted by drivers, such as gates or doors found unlocked or open or evidence of vandalism, should be reported to the School Police Department of the Miami-Dade County Public Schools, Tel: (305) 757-COPS (24 – hour telephone number).

Considering that many of the District's schools are located in community neighborhoods, the Contractor shall have their drivers observe all applicable ordinances and/or restrictions pertaining to operating times and noise abatement.

# **AUDIT AND INSPECTION OF RECORDS**

The Contractor shall maintain, and the District shall have the right to examine and audit, all the books, records, documents, accounting procedures and practices and other evidence regardless of form (e.g., machine-readable media such as disk, tape, etc.) or type (e.g., databases, applications software, database management software, utilities, etc.), sufficient to properly reflect all costs claimed to have been incurred, or anticipated to be incurred, in performing the Contract. If the Contractor maintains imaged documents, Contractor shall make such imaged documents available to the District at either the Contractor's site or the District's location in the event that the Contractor's site is not within close driving distance from the District.

The Contractor shall make said evidence (or to the extent accepted by the District, photographs, micro-photographs, or other authentic reproductions thereof) available to the District at the District's or the Contractor's offices (to be specified by the District) at all reasonable times and without charge to the District. Said evidence/records shall be available to the District within five (5) working days of a written request from the District. The Contractor shall, at no cost to the District, furnish assistance for such examination/audit. The Contractor and its Subcontractors and Suppliers shall keep and preserve all such records for a period of at least 3 years from and after final payment or if the Contract is terminated in whole or in part until 3 years after the final Contract close-out. The District's rights under this section shall also include access to the Contractor's offices for the purpose of interviewing the Contractor's employees.

Any information provided on machine-readable media (imaged documents) shall be provided in a format accessible and readable by the District. The Contractor shall obtain from its subcontractors and suppliers written agreements to the requirements of this Section and shall, upon the District's request, provide a copy of such agreements.

The Contractor shall provide the District, a listing of all non-student access sites, at which vending machines are installed, and shall be required to state the entity receiving the commission, the commission rate, location and number of machines at each site, content of the machines, and any other pertinent information, as requested by the District.

### VI. REQUIRED INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED BY PROPOSERS:

- A. The Proposer shall submit a list of the most recent/relevant comparable contracts, where vending arrangements similar to those proposed are currently in place.
- B. Proposers must be able to demonstrate the necessary financial resources. Financial statements for the last two years must be provided with the proposal.

- The District reserves the right to request additional information in order to evaluate the proposer's financial stability.
- C. Proposers must submit with the proposal, three letters of reference from institutions (public or private) for which the proposer is currently or within the past three years, has provided vending machine services similar to those outlined in this Request For Proposals.
- D. Type of company, (owned, public, private, corporation).
- E. Please indicate whether or not there has been any legal action against your company during the past five years. If so, please explain.
- F. Proof of insurance
- G. Cost proposal

# VII. Cost Proposal

- A. Proposer shall submit the minimum guaranteed monetary amount The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida would receive over the course of the fiveyear period, for the benefit of exclusive beverage pouring rights at all studentaccess and non-student access locations with the District, during the term of this contract. This amount shall not include any value of current or future marketing materials or "giveaways". The monetary amount offered by the proposer shall be paid to the School Board in equal payments at six-month intervals, commencing October 1, 2006.
- A. Proposer shall provide per case fixed purchase price on all proposed items to be sold for the student access areas self-vending program (must meet nutritional guidelines) and non-student access areas within the District, during the term of the contract. It is expected that the prices submitted shall remain firm for the contract period, as stated above. However, fluctuating market conditions during the contract period may affect the ability to maintain the original bid prices for the entire contract period. Therefore the awarded proposer may request a price adjustment based on verifiable changes in the market starting in May of each calendar year for the Board's consideration, to be effective July 1, of the same calendar year. If the request for price adjustment is approved by Procurement Management Services and Food and Nutrition, these changes would take effect after the close of business day on the Friday nearest to July 1.
  - M-DCPS will review all requests for price adjustments, and reserves the right to reject any and all requests as deemed to be in the best interest of M-DCPS.
- B. Proposer may also offer during the term of the contract any "rebates", case discounts, incentives for volume purchase and any additional programs or promotions to encourage sales which benefit the students of Miami-Dade County Public Schools.

#### VIII. TERMS OF CONTRACT

The term of the contract shall be for an initial five-year period and may, by mutual agreement between The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, and the awardee, be extended for an additional 5-year period. School Board reserves the right to cancel the contract in the event the services rendered do not comply with the provisions of the proposal and/or the quality of services are deemed inadequate. The proposer must comply with all municipal, state and federal statutes prohibiting discrimination, including, but not limited to discrimination based on race, religion, ethnicity, national origin and gender.

The School Board reserves the right to cancel the contract in the event the services rendered do not comply with the provisions of the proposal and/or the quality of services is found to be undesirable, upon giving sixty (60) days written notice.

At the end of the term of the contract or upon notice of termination, the awarded proposer shall have thirty (30) workdays to remove any and all machines, enclosures and other materials associated with this program. This removal of equipment and its components shall be at no cost to the district.

### IX. EVALUATION OF PROPOSALS

School District representatives will evaluate all proposals to identify the best leasing option most advantageous to the Board. The evaluation committee will include the following members or designees:

The evaluation committee will consider, but is not limited to examining, the following specific criteria:

- Financial stability of the Proposer and ability to provide requisite items specified in the RFP;
- Proposer's expertise and experience with similar projects in similar environments;
- · Proposer's stated costs for items to be purchased.
- · Proposer's cost proposal, including monetary offer for exclusivity rights.
- · Estimated time frame for completion of scope of work;
- Ability to accommodate M-DCPS district volume (schools, students, employees) and work within M-DCPS environment and culture.

The School Board reserves the right to reject any or all proposals, to further negotiate any proposals, to waive any irregularities or informalities, to accept or reject any items or combination of items, to request clarification of information submitted in any proposal and to request additional information from any proposer. Following the selection of a proposal and approval by the School Board, a professional services agreement acceptable to the School Board Attorney will be entered into with the successful proposer. Unsuccessful proposers will not receive additional information following the issuance of a final decision.

### X. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY AND M/WBE PARTICIPATION

Equal Employment Opportunity

 It is the policy of the School Board that no person will be denied access, employment, training, or promotion on the basis of gender, race, color, religion, ethnic or national origin, political beliefs, marital status, age, sexual orientation, social and family background, linguistic preference or disability, and that merit principles will be followed.

Each firm is requested to indicate its equal employment policy and provide a detailed breakdown by ethnicity, gender and occupational categories of its work force. (ATTACHMENT C)

2. Minority/Women Business Enterprise (M/WBE) Participation

The School Board has an active Minority/Women Business Enterprise (M/WBE) Program, to increase contracting opportunities for M/WBE's. In keeping with this policy, if a minority firm, which is Woman or African American-owned and operated, is to perform a scope of work, provide documentation to substantiate the experience of the M/WBE and its staff in providing this type of service. ### XI. GENERAL INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

# **Professional Liability**

The Professional Liability Insurance provided by the individual/firm shall conform to the following requirements:

- A. The individual firm's Professional Liability insurance shall be on a form acceptable to the Board and shall cover those sources of liability typically insured by Professional Liability Insurance, arising out of or the rendering or failure to render professional services in the performance of this agreement, including all provisions of indemnification which is part of this agreement.
- B. The insurance shall be subject to a maximum deductible not to exceed \$25,000.
- C. If on a claims-made basis, the individual/firm shall maintain without interruption, the Professional Liability Insurance until (3) years after this agreement.
- D. The minimum limits to be maintained by the individual/firm (inclusive of any amounts provided by an umbrella or excess policy) shall be \$1 million per claim/annual aggregate.

Each insurance policy evidencing the insurance required hereunder shall bear the appropriate endorsements whereby the insurance carrier waives any rights of subrogation acquired against the Board and the Students by reason of any payment under such policy and shall provide that such insurance carriers shall notify the Board in writing at least (30) days prior to any cancellation, termination, non-renewal or modification to the individual/firm's policy (ies) required under this agreement.

Upon the execution of this agreement, the individual/firm shall furnish to the Board's Office of Risk and Benefits Management with Certificates of Insurance evidencing the individual/firm's insurance coverage is consistent with the terms of the agreement. The individual/firm shall also provide copies of the polices to the Board. The individual/firm shall also provide the Board with renewal or replacement Certificates of Insurance no less than (30) days prior to cancellation, termination or modification. The individual/firm shall be in material breach of this agreement if the individual/firm fails to obtain replacement insurance coverage prior to the date in which coverage is terminated or expires. In this event the Board may terminate this agreement without further liability to the individual/firm. Additionally the individual/firm shall be liable to the Board for any and all damages incurred due to the individual/firm's failure to perform the agreement terms.

# XII. INDEMNIFICATION

The individual/firm(s) must enter into the following indemnification and hold harmless agreement:

The individual/firm(s) hereby agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend the Board, its officers, agents and employees individually and collectively from and against all liabilities, obligations, losses, damages, penalties, interest, claims, actions, assessments, fines, suits, demands, investigations, proceedings, judgments, orders or injuries, including death to any, or damage, of whatever nature, to any property and all costs including court costs and attorneys' fees, and disbursements, whether suit is instituted or not, and if instituted, at all tribunal levels (wherever raised by the parties hereto or a third party) imposed on, or incurred by or asserted against the Board or any of them arising out of or in connection with or based directly or indirectly upon (a) the individual/firm's directors, officers, employees, agents, subcontractors or representatives, of their duties and obligations under or pursuant to this agreement, including without limitations, the failure to maintain insurance or notify the Board; (b) any material breach of this agreement by the individual/firm(s), (c) false or inaccurate representation or warranty made by or on behalf of the individual/firm(s), and (d) any act or omission, negligence, or intentional acts of the individual/firm(s), or any of the individual/firm's directors, officers, employees, agents, subcontractors or other representatives.

# XIII. THE JESSICA LUNSFORD ACT BACKGROUND SCREENING REQUIREMENTS

In accordance with the requirements of sections 1012.32, 1012.465, and 435.04, Florida Statutes (2004) as well as with the requirements of HB 1877, The Jessica Lunsford Act (2005), effective September 1, 2005, Contractor agrees to certify under oath and penalty of perjury, see **ATTACHMENT D** (Sworn Statement Pursuant to Sections 1012.32, 1012.465, and 435.04, Florida Statutes (2004) and HB 1877, The Jessica Lunsford Act (2005)) which is incorporated fully herein by reference, that Contractor and all of its employees who provide or may provide services under this Agreement have completed all background screening requirements as outlined in the above-referenced statutes.

Additionally, Contractor agrees that each of its employees, representatives, agents, subcontractors or suppliers who are permitted access on school grounds when students are present, who have direct contact with students or who have access to or control of school funds must meet level 2 screening requirements as described in sections 1012.32 and 435.04, Florida Statutes, and further upon obtaining level 2 clearance, must obtain a required Board issued photo identification badge which shall be worn by the individual at all times while on Board property when students are present.

Contractor agrees to bear any and all costs associated with acquiring the required background screening – including any costs associated with fingerprinting and obtaining the required photo identification badge. Contractor agrees to require all its affected employees to sign a statement, as a condition of employment with Contractor in relation to performance under this Agreement, agreeing that the employee will abide by the heretofore described background screening requirements, and also agreeing that the employee will notify the Contractor/Employer of any arrest(s) or conviction(s) of any offense enumerated in s. 435.04, Florida Statutes within 48 hours of its occurrence.

Contractor agrees to provide the Board with a list of all of its employees who have completed background screening as required by the above-referenced statutes and who meet the statutory requirements contained therein. Contractor agrees that it has an ongoing duty to maintain and update these lists as new employees are hired and in the event that any previously screened employee fails to meet the statutory standards. Contractor further agrees to notify the Board immediately upon becoming aware that one of its employees who was previously certified as completing the background check and meeting the statutory standards is subsequently arrested or convicted of any disqualifying offense. Failure by Contractor to notify the Board of such arrest or conviction within 48 hours of being put on notice and within 5 business days of the occurrence of a qualifying arrest or conviction shall constitute grounds for immediate termination of this Agreement by the Board.

The parties further agree that failure by Contractor to perform any of the duties described in this section shall constitute a material breach of the Agreement entitling the Board to terminate this Agreement immediately with no further responsibility to make payment or perform any other duties under this Agreement.

# COMPLIANCE WITH SCHOOL CODE

Contractor agrees to comply with all sections of the Florida K-20 Education Code, Title XLVIII, Florida Statutes, as it presently exists, and further as it may be amended from time to time. Further Contractor agrees that failure to comply with the Florida K-20 Education Code shall constitute a material breach of this Agreement and may result in the termination of this Agreement by the Board.

# XIV. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Former Miami-Dade County Public Schools employees, classified as Managerial Exempt Personnel, Pay Grade 22 and above, Dade County School Administrators Association, Pay Grade 47 and above, and other equivalent positions, are prohibited from personally representing another person or entity or acting as an agent or attorney for compensation in connection with any matter in which The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, is interested, for two years after the School Board employees' service terminates. This provision is pursuant to School Board Rule 6Gx13 – 4A-1.212 and Florida Statute § 112.313(9).

The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida shall be prohibited from entering into any business relationship or continue an existing business relationship with any person or entity determined to have engaged in violation of the restriction contained in this provision.

# XV. PUBLIC RECORDS LAW

It is the practice of The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, to evaluate all Requests For Proposals in a public forum open to the Sunshine, pursuant to Florida Statute §286.011, and to make available for public inspection and copying any information received in response to an RFP, in accordance with Florida Statute §119, as such, any information sent to M-DCPS is being sent into the public domain. No action on the part of the proposer would create an obligation of confidentiality on the part of the School Board, including but not limited to, making a reference in the proposal to the trade secret statutes, Florida Statutes §§ 812.081, 815.045. It is recommended that potential suppliers exclude from their response any information that, in their judgment, may be considered a trade secret.

# HEALTHY BEVERAGES AND FOOD GUIDELINES

M-DCPS is committed to providing an environment in which all students can make healthful food choices for lifelong health. As such, the following Healthy Food and Beverage Guidelines will be implemented effective July 1, 2006 for <u>all</u> food sales before, during, and 1 hour after school.

# Beverage guidelines

- Only fruit-based drinks, composed of no less than 50% fruit juices with no added sweeteners, artificial flavors or colors.
- Drinking water with no additives except those minerals normally added to tap water.
- Electrolyte replacement drinks that do not contain more than 34 grams of added sweetener per 16 ounce serving; 16 ounce maximum volume.
- Milk and flavored milks, all milk should contain Vitamin A and D at levels specified by the Food and Drug Administration.

# The following are not allowed:

- Carbonated beverages
- Beverages containing additives such as herbal and non-vitamin supplements
- Food colorings and flavors not proven safe by the Food and Drug Administration
- Beverages containing vitamin and/or mineral supplements
- · Beverages in glass containers
