INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

L PREPAREIG OF BIDS

- A. BIDDER QUALIFICATION FORM qualifies the bidder and the bid and must be completed and submitted as page 1 of the bid.
- 1. PERFORMANCE SECURITY. The form of performance security the bidder will submit, when required to do so, must be furnished. Performance security shall not be submitted with the bid.
- 2. BEDDER CERTIFICATION AND EDERTIFICATION. Bid must contain an original manual signature from an authorized representative. An unsigned bid will be considered non responsive.
- B. INSTRUCTIONS TO BODERS define conditions of the bid.
- 1. ORDER OF PRECEDENCE. Any inconsistency in this bid shall be resolved by giving precedence in the following order:
 - A. Specfications
 - B. Special Conditions
 - C. Instructions To Bidders
- 2. FOR MAUBE designated bids. The SPECIAL CONDITIONS-Minority/Momen. owned and controlled Business Paticipation Statement and the MAUBE Cedification Application MUST be completed and SUBMITTED with the bid if the bidder is not certified by Miami-Dade County Public Schools. Failure to submit the completed application with the bid will be considered non responsible.
- C. BIO PROPOSAL FORM defines requirement of terms to be purchased, and must be completed and submitted as page 2 and subsequent pages, it any, of the bid. The bidder should indicate histher name in the appropriate space on each page.
- 1. ITEM SPECFICATION. Specifying a certain brand, make or manufacturer is to denote the quality, type, and standard of the addice desired. Addices offered must be new merchandise only, of equal or superior grade. On blank lines provided, the bidder is requested to insert the brand name, manufacturer's number and other information necessary to sufficiently identify addice offered. Failure to do so may prevent consideration of the tem. Also, refer to paragraph IX: Packaging.
- 2. PROTEST OF SPECIFICATIONS. Bidders and proposers may file letters of protest which shall serve as a notice of protest, with the School Board Clerk, and the Bureau of Procurement and Materials Maragement, within 72 hours prior to the date and hour specified in the Bidder Qualification Form for receipt of bids. The letters of protest will be reviewed by the Bureau of Procurement and Materials Management and will offer the protesting bidder the opportunity to meet and discuss the ments of the protest. If the protest is not resolved, the bidder may seek an administrative hearing pursuant to § § 120.569 and 120.57, Fla., Stat., by fling a formal written protest within 10 days after fling the notice of protest. Petitions for hearing on protests pursuant to § § 120.569 and 120.57, Fla., Stat., must be filed in accordance with School Board Rue 60:d3-8C-L064. Failure to file a timety notice of protest or failure to file a timety formal written protest shall constitute a weiver of the proceedings. This provision supersedes and governs over any conflicting provision in this document.
- 3. PRICES. Prices are requested in units of quartity specified in the bid specifications. In case of a discrepancy in computing the total amount of bid, UNIT PRICE quoted will govern. All prices bid shall include delivery F.O.B. destination, freight prepail bidder pays and bears freight charges. Bidder owns goods in transit and files any claims) and shall include all cartage, drayage, packing, etc., delivered to and unbaded at the receiving station at the site designated in BID PROPOSAL FORMS and there received by the designated agent of the Board.
- 4. TAXES. The Board does not pay Federal Excise and State taxes on direct purchases of tanglide personal property. The applicable tax exemption number is shown on the purchase order. This exemption does not apply to purchases of tanglide personal property made by contractors who use the tanglide personal property in the performance of contracts for the improvement of Board owned real property as defined in Chapter 192 of the Florita Statutes.

II. SUBMITTING OF BIDS

A. BED FORMS AND ENVELOPES. Bids must be submitted on forms furnished by the Board and in sealed envelopes. Envelopes must be clearly marked with bid number, tild tille and tild opening.

- 8. ERASURES OR CORRECTIONS. When filing out the bid proposal form, bidders are required to use a typewater or complete bid proposal in tik.
 - 1. Use of pencil is prohibited.
 - 2. Do not crase or use correction fluid to correct an error.
 - 3. All changes must be crossed out and initiated in ink.

Those bids for individual terms that do not comply with items 1, 2 and 3 above will be considered non-responsive forthat items?

- C. PLACE, DATE AND HOUR. Bids shall be submitted by U.S. Mail, CourievExpress Service, or deposited in the BID BOX located in Room 351, 800 A.M. to 4:30 P.M., Monday through Friday, SCHOOL BOARD ADMINISTRATION BUILDING, 1450 N.E. Second Avenue, Miami, Florida 33132. Bids received after the date and hour specified in the BIDDER QUALLIFICATION FORM will not be considered.
- O. PUBLIC ENTITY CREMES. Section 267.133(2)(c) Fiorida Statute. A person or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime may not submit a bid on a contract to provide any goods or services to a public entity, may not submit a bid on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work, may not submit bids on bases of seal property to a public entity, may not be awarded or perform work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor, or consultant under a contract with any public entity, and may not transact business with any public entity in excess of the threshold amount provided in Section 267.017, for CATEGORY TWO for a period of 36 months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list.
- E. SUBINITING A "NO BID." If not submitting a bid at this time, return the form entitled "NOTICE TO PROSPECTIVE BIDDERS." Failure to respond, either by submitting a bid or the "NOTICE TO PROSPECTIVE BIDDERS" form for three consecutive times may result in your company being removed from the School Board's bid list.
- F. AVALABLITY OF BID REPORMATION. Immediately following the public opening, bids will be read, upon request, and then compiled in a tabular form, a copy of which will be available for examination in Procurement Management and Materials Testing.

IL CANCELLATION OF BIDS ORREQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

An invitation for bids or Request For Proposals, or other solicitations may be canceled, in whole or in part, as may be specified in the solicitation, when it is in the best interest of the Board. The reasons shall be made a part of the master bid file.

A. Prior to opening, a solicitation may be canceled in whole or in pair, prior to the date and hour specified in the Eldder Qualification Form for receipt of bids, when the Associate Superintendent, Bureau of Procument and Materials Management, determines in writing that such action is in the best interest of the Board for reasons including, but not limited to:

- 1. The Board no longer requires the supplies, services, or construction;
- 2. The Board no longer can reasonably expect to fund the procurement;
- 3. A review of a valid protest filed by a kidder as may be determined by the administrative staff; and
- 4. Proposed amendments to the solicitation would be of such magnitude that a newsolicitation is destrable.
- B. When a solicitation is canceled prior to opening, notice of cancellation shall be sent to all businesses solicited, via facsimile ormail and bids or proposals returned to the vendor unopened.
- C. The notice of cancellation shall:
 - 1. Identify the solicitation;
 - 2. Briefly explain the reason for cancellation; and
- Where appropriate, exclain that an opportunity will be given to compete
 on any re-solicitation on any future procurements of similar supplies,
 services, or construction.

W. CHANGE OR WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

- A. PRIOR TO BID OPENRIG. Should the bidder desire to charge or withdraw his/her bid he/she shall do so in willing. This communication is to be received by the District Director, Division of Procurement Management and Materials Testing, Room 364, School Board Administration Building, prior to date and hour of bid opening. The bidder's name, the bid number, the bid life and the date the bid is due must appear on the envelope.
- B. AFTER BID OPENBIG. After bids are opened, they may not be changed, nor withdrawn for 90 days after the determined opening date unless otherwise specified on the "BIDDER QUALIFICATION FORM."
- C. FALURE TO ACCEPT BID AYARD. Bidders who, prior to the Eid Award by The School Board of Miami- Dade County, Florida, indicate that they are unable to accept the tid award shall ether.
- 1. Payto the Board, as liquidated damages an amount equal to 5% of the unit price bid times the quartity or \$10, whichever amount is larger, or
- 2. Lose eligibility to transact new business with the Board for a period of 14 months from the date the Board acts on the withdrawn bid.

V. AWARDS

- A RESERVATION FOR REJECTION OR AMARD. The Board reserves the right to reject any or all bids, to waive irregularities or technicalities, and to request rebids. The Board reserves the right to award on an individual item basis, any combination of items, total low bid or, if an atemate bid is accepted, on such terms as are specified for the atemate bid, whichever manner is in the best interest of the Board.
- B. ANARD RECOMMENDATION. Bidder/Proposer information phone lines have been established in Procurement. Management. Bidders/proposers may call 995-1375, each Fidday, to be advised of the recommended bidders or proposers and the time it is contemplated that the recommendation will be made. This information will be provided by school system staff as available. In no case will information as to a recommended bidder/proposer be available later than the Friday preceding the week when the award is scheduled to be made by the School Board or the Superintendent.

Bidders and proposers may file letters of protests, with the School Board Clerk, within 72 hours after the posting of the bid tabulation or receipt of notice of the Board's decision or intended decision. The letters of protest will be reviewed by the Bureau of Procurement and Materials Management and will offer the protesting bidder the opportunity to meet and discuss the merts of the protest. If the bidder is not satisfied with the response to the protest, heather may invoke the provisions of § § 120.569 and 120.57, Fla.Stat. Petitions for hearings on protests pursuant to § § 120.569 and 120.57, Fla.Stat. Protests field in accordance with School Board Rule 6Gx13-8C-1.064. Protests field laterthan the date specified herein shall constitute a weiver of proceedings under Chapter 120 Florita Statutes. This provision supersedes and governs over any conflicting provision in this document.

- C. OFFICIAL ANIARD DATE. Awards become official when made unless otherwise specified in the award recommendation.
- D. PURCHASE ORDERS. Purchase orders maled to successful bidders are the official notification to deliver materials described therein; and the time allowed for delivery begins with the date of the purchase order. In the event that the successful tidder fails to deliver the materials in accordance with the terms and conditions of the bid and purchase order, the bidder shall be considered in default of the contract and subject to the default provisions stated in Instructions to Bidders, Section V. E.
- E. DEFALLT. In the event of defaut, which may include, but is not limited to non-performance and/or poor performance, the awardees shall pay to the Board as liquidated damages an amount equal to 10% of the unit price of the item(s) awarded, times the quantity when no purchase order has been issued, 10 percent of the purchase order when a purchase order has been issued or \$100, whichever is greater. Where no performance bond or check has been required, each awardee who talls to pay the liquidated damages within 15 days after it is invoked shall lose eligibility to transact new business with the Board for a period of 14 months from date of termination of award by the Board.

Bidders who are determined ineligible may request a hearing pursuant to §120.589 Fia. Stat., and School Board Rule 6Gx43-8C-1.064.

The Board reserves the right to weive liquidated damages/loss of eligibility.

F. The intent of the bid documents is to include only the walton measurements for malerials, equipment, systems, standards and workenanship necessary for the proper execution and completion of the work by the Bidder. The bid documents shall not be construed to create an entitiement to any other scope of work except as specified herein.

VI. PERFORMANCE SECURITY (FOR SUCCESSFUL BIDDERS ONLY

Current certificate of authority as acceptable surety on Federal Bonds in accordance with the latest edition of the United States Treasury Department Circular 570 entitled "Companies Holding Certificates of Authority as Acceptable Sureties on Federal Bonds and as Acceptable Reinsuring Companies" shall be accepted for an amount not exceeding the underwaiting limitation thereon.

2. Awards of \$100,000 or Less

Bonds shall be written with a surety company or corporation meeting the qualifications as set forth in Paragraph VI. B. above or the qualifications set forth in section 287.0935, Florida Statutes.

- C. AMOURT. When required as defined therein, the firm or individua(s) to whom an award has been made shall execute and detiverto The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, a Performance Bond, Cashier's/Certified Check.or equal.
- 1. Awards less than \$200,000 shall be exempt from performance security.
- Pelformance security shall not be required unless otherwise defined in the bid specifications. If Pelformance security is required, it shall equal 100% of the award amount.
- D. RELEASE OF PERFORMANCE SECURITY. Return to the Awardee of his hier cash security, or notification to the Awardee and the bonding company to cancel the performance bond, will be made when all goods services have been accepted and invoices have been approved for payment.

VIL SAMPLES.

- F. RETURN OF SAMPLES. Samples not destroyed in testing may be claimed by unsuccessful bidders 14 days after bid award date and by successful bidders 14 days after final payment; but the Board will assume no responsibility for samples not claimed within the time specified, and it will pay for no samples damaged in testing.
- G. XIV. NO GRATUITY POLICY.

It is the policy of the Bureau of Procurement and Materials Management not to accept gifts, gratuities, or favors of any kind, or of any value whatsoever, from vendors, members of their staffs, or families.

COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL REGULATIONS

A. All contracts involving Federal funds will contain certain provisions required by applicable sections of Title 34, Section 80.36(1) and Section 85.510 Code of Federal Regulations and are included by reference herein. The vendor certifies by signing the bid that the vendor and hisher principals are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from participation in Federally funded transactions and may, in certain instances, be required to provide a separate written certification to this effect.

During the term of any contract with the Board, in the event of debarment, suspension, proposed debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from participation in Federally funded transactions, the vendor shall immediately notify the Associate Superintendent, Bureau of Procurement and Materials Management, in writing.

XVI. DISCREMENTION
