INSTRUCTIONS TO AGENCY/PROPOSER SUBMITTING PROPOSAL

I. PREPARING OF PROPOSALS

- A. THE PROPOSAL IS TO BE SUBMITTED, using 8-1/2" x 11" paper.
- B. IDENTIFICATION. Failure to indicate the contractor's EXACT legal name and an unsigned proposal may be considered non-responsive.

II. SUBMITTING OF PROPOSALS

- A. Number of Proposals:

A total of (12) copies of the Proposal must be submitted as follows:

- * The original proposal in a sealed envelope or box marked "Original."
- ** (11) copies of the proposal in a separate sealed envelope or box marked "Copies."

The proposal number, proposal title and opening date must be clearly marked on all envelopes and boxes.

- B. Place, Date and Hour. Proposals shall be submitted to The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, Procurement Management, Room 352, 1450 N.E. 2nd Avenue, Miami, Florida, not later than 2:00 P.M. April 13, 2006.

III. CHANGE OR WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSAL

- A. PRIOR TO PROPOSAL OPENING. Should the agency or individual contractor withdraw its proposal, they shall do so in writing. This communication is to be received by the Assistant Superintendent, Procurement Management Services, 1450 N.E. 2nd Avenue, prior to April 13, 2006. The agency or individual contractor's name and the proposal number should appear on the envelope.
- B. AFTER PROPOSAL OPENING. After April 13, 2006, proposals may not be changed; and they may not be withdrawn for one hundred twenty (120) days from that date.

IV. PROTEST TO CONTRACT SOLICITATION OR AWARD

- A. The Board shall provide notice of a decision or intended decision concerning a solicitation, contract award, or exceptional purchase by electronic posting. This notice shall contain the following statement:

"Failure to file a protest within the time prescribed in Section 120.57(3), Florida Statutes, shall constitute a waiver of proceedings under Chapter 120, Florida Statutes."

- B. Any person who is adversely affected by the agency decision or intended decision, shall file with the agency a notice of protest in writing within 72 hours after the posting of the notice of decision or intended decision. With respect to a protest of the terms, conditions, and specifications contained in a solicitation, including any provisions governing the methods of ranking proposals or replies, awarding contracts, reserving rights of further negotiation or modifying or amending any contract, the notice of protest shall be filed in writing within 72 hours after the posting of the solicitation. The formal written protest shall be filed within 10 days after the date of the notice of protest is filed. Failure to file a notice of protest or failure to file a formal written protest shall constitute a waiver of proceedings. The formal written protest shall state with particularity the facts and law upon which the protest is based. Saturdays, Sundays, and state holidays shall be excluded in the computation of the 72-hour time periods provided by this paragraph.
- C. The notice of protest will be reviewed by Procurement Services staff, which will offer the protesting proposer the opportunity to meet and discuss the merits of the protest. If the protest is not resolved, the proposer may seek an administrative hearing pursuant to 120.57 Florida Statutes, by filing a formal written protest within 10 days after filing the notice of protest. Petitions for hearings on protests pursuant to 120.57 Florida Statutes must be filed in accordance with School Board Rule 6Gx13-8C-1064.

V. AWARDS

- A. **RESERVATION FOR REJECTION OR AWARD.** The Board reserves the right to reject any and all proposals, to waive irregularities or technicalities, and to request re-bids.
- B. **NOTIFICATION OF INTENDED ACTION.** Notices will be posted on the District's website 7-10 days prior to a regularly scheduled Board meeting.
- C. **OFFICIAL AWARD DATE.** Awards become official upon Board action.
- D. **CHARTER SCHOOLS:** Items awarded under this contract shall be made available to charter schools authorized by the School Board.

VI. DEFAULT

In the event of default, which may include, but is not limited to non-performance and/or poor performance, the awardee shall lose eligibility to transact new business with the Board for a period of 14 months from date of termination of award by the Board. Proposers that are determined ineligible may request a hearing pursuant to §120.569, Fla. Stat., and School Board Rule 6Gx13-8C-1.064.

VII. PUBLIC ENTITY CRIMES

Section 287.133(2)(a) Florida Statute. A person or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime may not submit a bid on a contract to provide any goods or services to a public entity, may not submit a bid on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work, may not submit bids on leases of real property to a public subcontractor, or consultant under a contract with any public entity, and may not transact business with any public entity in excess of the threshold amount provided in Section 287.017, for CATEGORY TWO for a period of 36 months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list.

VIII. COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL REGULATIONS

All contracts involving Federal funds will contain certain provisions required by applicable sections of Title 34, Section 80.36(I) and Section 85.510 Code of Federal Regulations and are included by reference herein. The vendor certifies by signing the proposal that the vendor and its principals are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from participation in Federally funded transactions and may, in certain instances, be required to provide a separate written certification to this effect.

During the term of any contract with the Board, in the event of debarment, suspension, proposed debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from participation in Federally funded transactions, the vendor shall immediately notify the Assistant Superintendent, Procurement Management Services, in writing.

Vendors will also be required to provide access to records, which are directly pertinent to the contract and retain all required records for three years after the grantee (The Board) or sub-grantee makes final payment.

For all contracts involving Federal funds, in excess of \$10,000, The Board reserves the right to terminate the contract for cause as well as for convenience by issuing a certified notice to the vendor.

IX. CONE OF SILENCE
BOARD RULE 6GX13-8C-1.212

DEFINITION:

A. "Cone of Silence" means a prohibition on any communication regarding a particular Request for Proposals (RFP), bid, or other competitive solicitation between:

1. any person who seeks an award therefrom, including a potential vendor or vendor's representative; and
2. any School Board member or the member's staff, the Superintendent, Deputy Superintendent and their respective support staff, or any person appointed by the School Board to evaluate or recommend selection in such procurement process.

The Cone of Silence shall not apply to communication with the School Board Attorney or his or her staff, or with designated school district staff, who are not serving on the particular Procurement Committee, to obtain clarification or information concerning the subject solicitation. For purposes of this section, "vendor's representative" means an employee, partner, director, or officer of a potential vendor, or consultant, lobbyist, or actual or potential subcontractor or sub-consultant of a vendor, or any other individual acting through or on behalf of any person seeking an award.

B. A Cone of Silence shall be applicable to each RFP, bid, or other competitive solicitation during the solicitation and review of bid proposals. At the time of issuance of the solicitation, the Superintendent or the Superintendent's designee shall provide public notice of the Cone of Silence. The Superintendent shall include in any advertisement and public solicitation for goods and services a statement disclosing the requirements of this section.

C. The Cone of Silence shall terminate at the time the Superintendent of Schools submits a written recommendation to award or approve a contract, to reject all bids or responses, or otherwise takes action which ends the solicitation and review process.

D. Nothing contained herein shall prohibit any potential vendor or vendor's representative:

1. from making public representations at duly noticed pre-bid conferences or before duly noticed selection and negotiation committee meetings;
2. from engaging in contract negotiations during any duly noticed public meeting;
3. from making a public presentation to the School Board during any duly noticed public meeting; or
4. from communicating in writing with any school district employee or official for purposes of seeking clarification or additional information, subject to the provisions of the applicable RFP, or bid documents.

The potential vendor or vendor's representative shall file a copy of any written communication with the School Board Clerk who shall make copies available to the public upon request.

- E. Nothing contained herein shall prohibit the Procurement Committee's representative from initiating contact with a potential vendor or vendor's representative and subsequent communication related thereto for the purposes of obtaining further clarifying information regarding a response to an RFP, or competitive solicitation. Such contact shall be in writing and shall be provided to the members of the applicable Procurement Committee, including any response thereto.
- F. Any violation of this rule shall be investigated by the School Board's Inspector General and may result in any recommendation for award, or any RFP award, or bid award to said potential vendor or vendor's representative being deemed void or voidable. The potential vendor or vendor's representative determined to have violated this rule, shall be subject to debarment. In addition to any other penalty provided by law, violation of this rule by a school district employee shall subject the employee to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal.

I. NAME AND ADDRESS OF REQUESTER

II. PURPOSE OF REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

The purpose of this Request For Proposals (RFP) is to select a proposer to enter into a contract with Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) for a turn-key leasing arrangement for the equipment components necessary to self-operate a vending program at all district school sites and facilities. The proposer selected will have exclusive rights for vending equipment within Miami-Dade County Public Schools. Multiple machines will be located in student access areas district-wide. This proposal is for the lease of vending machines and enclosures only. M-DCPS will be responsible for the purchase and stocking of products to be sold in the vending machines.

III. INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMISSION OF PROPOSALS

Twelve copies of the proposal, one of which shall be an original, must be received by 2:00 p.m. (Eastern Standard Time) April 13, 2006, at:

The responsibility for submitting this proposal to the District on or before the stated time and date will be solely and strictly the responsibility of the Proposer. The District will not be responsible for delays caused by the United States Post Office or any other delivery service or for delays resulting from any other occurrence. The proposal must be submitted in a sealed envelope or box marked "**SELF-OPERATED VENDING PROGRAM**".

It is anticipated that a proposal may be presented to The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, for acceptance on or about May 10, 2006. In the event that the proposal is accepted, notice to the successful proposer(s) will be sent on or about May 10, 2006. The Board reserves the right to accept or reject any and all proposals.

IV. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The school district of Miami-Dade County, Florida, is the fourth largest school system in the nation. The district has approximately 340 schools, charter schools, alternative schools, vocational/adult education and exceptional student education centers; approximately 363,288 students and more than 57,372 full and part-time employees. The student population is economically, ethnically, and linguistically diverse, with the largest ethnic group being Hispanic students.

The proposer shall be responsible for all cost associated with the requirements of this RFP, including installation/removal of machines, repairs, maintenance, vandalism, security devices against theft, enclosures, theft, fire, water damage, etc.

Attachment A is a listing of schools within M-DCPS, which will be covered under this contract. Additional school sites may be added.

Proposers must have the capability to begin the implementation process upon award of this contract and have substantial completion upon mutual agreement between the successful proposer and The Department of Food and Nutrition.

V. SCOPE OF SERVICES

The purpose of this Request For Proposals is to enter into a lease arrangement to obtain all components necessary for the district to self-operate a vending program at district school sites, facilities and or determined sites, to include, but not be limited to, the following:

1. Vending Machines
2. Enclosures
3. Computerized monitoring systems
4. Delivery, installation, maintenance and repair
5. All inclusive on-site training and technical assistance throughout the contract period, as required.

The Scope of Services includes the following key components:

The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, shall have "bays" located at designated locations, within schools and other facilities throughout the district. The "bays" shall be either a single, double or triple. The number and type of "bays" will be determined through mutual agreement between the successful proposer and the school or facility administrator/designee and/or Department of Food and Nutrition

designee. It is anticipated that the majority of the bays will be configured as triple. For the purpose of this RFP the bays will be considered to be the three types listed above.

The "bays" shall be enclosed in a reinforced metal enclosure that has the ability to attach various print/marketing materials on the outside with a reinforced metal door to fully enclose the units, whenever needed. The enclosure shall be secured to the floor by the successful proposer. The vending machines must fit into the enclosure. The successful proposer shall be responsible for the delivery, installation and repair of enclosures and machines.

The district will be responsible for providing additional electrical outlets at any location, if required.

The successful proposer shall provide training, on-going training, service and maintenance during the term of the Agreement. The District reserves the right to make a final determination as to the location of any bay or to request any changes, for accessibility or safety, at its sole discretion.

The Department of Food and Nutrition shall take full responsibility for the operation of the self-vending program, including, providing food or beverage products for the machines and collection of monies.

Training and On-Site Assistance

- The successful proposer shall provide training to specified staff on all components needed to self-operate vending machines and enclosures and shall be inclusive of any hardware or software components.
- The successful proposer shall provide on-site training provided on an as needed basis, after the initial implementation of the program.
- The successful proposer shall provide all necessary training manuals, guides, booklets, posters or other materials needed for training staff.
- Training will be scheduled upon mutual agreement between the successful proposer and The Department of Food and Nutrition designated staff.
- Training will be unlimited until staff is knowledgeable of all aspects of operating the program.
- Proposer must provide training assistance throughout the term of the contract.

Delivery, Installation, Service and Repair

- Successful proposers will provide included in final price all direct delivery to specified sites. Final determination as to the placement of equipment will be made by the Department of Food and Nutrition.
- Proposer shall install enclosures and attach to concrete or base as directed.
- Proposers shall provide continuous dedicated service and training technician(s) as needed to accommodate number of sites.
- Proposer shall maintain the equipment in good repair, appearance, condition

and working order and shall furnish all parts, mechanisms and devices required to keep the equipment in good working order.

- Response time for repairs shall be as soon as possible, but no more than two (2) work days after notification via telephone/fax or by other communication means acceptable to both parties.
- Proposer shall provide toll free dedicated phone numbers and e-mail addresses to enable sites to make immediate contact.
- Proposer shall assume the risk of loss and damage to the vending equipment from malicious or intentional acts by others. Proposers shall repair or replace vending equipment/enclosures with similar equipment. Proposer shall repair and/or replace all equipment/enclosures, due to natural disasters such as hurricane, floods, windstorms or any other similar acts.
- Proposer shall provide "loaner" equipment should any machine or enclosures be deemed unusable or non-repairable for more than two (2) workdays.
- Initial delivery and implementation shall be mutually agreed upon with district administrative designee and the successful proposer.
- All servicing of equipment shall take place during normal school hours unless otherwise instructed by the site administrator. Each service call must be logged in with the front office of each site unless otherwise instructed.
- All service personnel must follow all district guidelines in adherence with the Jessica Lundsford Act. Service personnel must be in a type of uniform, or professional clothing that does not contain any offensive language, pictures or graphics. Service personnel are strictly forbidden from engaging in any interaction with the students of Miami-Dade County Public Schools.
- Proposer or its subcontractor shall follow all rules and regulations pertaining to safe driving on school grounds and surrounding neighborhoods, particularly when students are present.

VENDING MACHINE EQUIPMENT

The following specifications are considered minimum requirements for equipment to be installed. Other vending machine/enclosure equipment specifications will be considered by the Board.

Vending Machines:

- Web based wireless monitoring hardware and remote monitoring capabilities and provides wireless access to all functions and information on vending equipment. Provide cash accounting features and open/close door features for security. Provide user to view "real time" sales.
- New machines or have only been previously used for manufacturer testing.
- Must be "generic" and have capability to attach signage to the front or "panels" for future custom advertising/graphics.
- Multi-selection, multi-pricing capability with an adequate reasonable number of "slots".
- Branded machines will not be accepted.
- Energy efficient machines with the "energy star" label or equivalent for each

vending machine. Proposer may attach an energy saving device and document provided before installation. Any energy device will be installed at the proposer's expense.

- The vending machines may be three types, "milk based" beverage, non-milk based beverage and snack vending machines. If possible the beverage machines may be interchangeable or inclusive of both "milk based" and "non-milk based".

Enclosures:

- Single Unit Enclosures: 62" wide x 42" deep x 95" high with inside dimensions of 42.75" opening width x 82" open height. Vending enclosure shall have 50" radius sides.
- Double Unit Enclosure: 102" wide x 42" deep x 95" high with inside dimensions of 82.5" opening width x 82" open height. Vending enclosure shall have the 50" radius sides.
- Triple Unit Enclosure: 150" wide x 42" deep x 95" high with inside dimensions of 130.5" opening width x 82" opening height. Vending enclosures shall have 50" radius sides.
- All enclosures shall have no visible or exterior fasteners on the exterior of the security enclosure.
- All units to have an exterior finish with anti-graffiti polyurethane powder coat. Exterior finish to be a minimum thickness of 2.5 mil, with glossy finish sheen. Interior finish to be polyurethane polymer powder coat with finish minimum thickness of 2.5 mil. Colors to be determined. Chassis is to be constructed of 14 gage electro galvanized steel type, CS type A: 20G/20G: NCT Oil.
- All exterior welds are to be ground smooth with the surface of the enclosure.
- Enclosure must be anchored with a minimum of 6 3/8" anchor bolts.
- No exterior or visible locks, or locking devices visible from the outside.
- Enclosure must be expandable.
- Enclosure to have capability of back lighting.
- Enclosure should be free standing.
- Enclosures should have the capability to attach to each other back-to-back or side-to-side.
- Door of enclosure must be recessed into top and not visible in the open position and secure when open or closed. Door should be made of G96 galvanized steel and able to withstand loads of 80 mph force. If equal material is used then it must withstand the minimum of 80 mph force. Guide to be constructed from one continuous length of steel. No welding is permitted.
- Security door or bottom bar should not be able to extend past the bottom of the door guides. Guides should have a stop to prevent the security door or bottom bar from traveling past the top of the door guides.
- Door actuation may be automatic via remote control or manual. Locking method may also be automatic or manual. Enclosure to include timer activated motion sensing alarm system. Door to have limited switches that can be adjusted as needed. Safety measures to prevent door overload and sensors to ensure safety if any obstruction. Door should have a manual unlock feature to allow

access to the vending equipment if electrical power is lost. One remote control to be supplied with each enclosure, if automatic. Mounting must be on concrete or provided mounting pad to be installed by awarded contractor, if needed.

VEHICLE SAFETY AND SECURITY

The rules and regulations pertaining to safe driving on school grounds, and surrounding neighborhoods particularly when students and children are present, must be adhered to. The Contractor's drivers shall exercise extreme caution at all times and be sensitive to community concerns regarding excessive noise.

Drivers entering school premises when school is not in session shall lock any gate or door to which they have access, both when entering and/or leaving the grounds. Gate keys, as may be required, will be furnished by the site administrator supervising the service. Any unusual condition noted by drivers, such as gates or doors found unlocked or open or evidence of vandalism, should be reported to the School Police Department of the Miami-Dade County Public Schools, Tel: (305) 757-COPS (24 – hour telephone number).

Considering that many of the District's schools are located in community neighborhoods, the Contractor shall have their drivers observe all applicable ordinances and/or restrictions pertaining to operating times and noise abatement.

LOCATION/REMOVAL AND ADDITION OF VENDING MACHINES

The District reserves the right to increase or decrease the number and/or type of machines at each location. No equipment shall be added or removed by the contractor without prior written approval of the Site Administrator or his/her authorized designee and/or Department of Food and Nutrition designee.

The site administrator and contractor shall work together to determine the optimum number of vending machines that need to be placed on campus or other locations to maximize sales and also minimize the Contractor's equipment investment.

At the time of expiration or termination of contract, the Contractor shall remove all vending machines installed by its company, without damage to the building and property, within thirty (30) days of request and shall restore in good order and condition those areas utilized for these operations. This removal shall be at not cost to the District.

VI. REQUIRED INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED BY PROPOSER

- A. Detailed information regarding the proposer's experience and qualifications in providing the program required. Include sufficient information regarding capacity to meet M-DCPS requirements.

- B. Specific details outlining the implementation plan. Please include estimated timeline needed from start of program to the anticipated completion/full implementation.
- C. A minimum of three (3) professional/business references where the scope of services is similar to those outlines in the RFP.
- D. Proof of Insurance
- E. Copy of proposed lease agreement, with proposed payment arrangements.
- F. Breakdown of all leasing costs, per type of vending machine and enclosure, to be supplied under this contract.
- G. Complete manufacturers specifications on all machines and enclosures to be used under this contract.

VII. LEASE ARRANGEMENT

Proposer(s) should provide a written narrative explaining each element of the lease proposal, covering all types of vending machines and enclosures to be installed under this contract. The proposal should clearly indicate a structure that reflects a comprehensive financial arrangement the provision of all services outlined in this RFP.

VIII. TERMS OF CONTRACT

The term of the contract shall be for an initial five-year period and may, by mutual agreement between The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, and the awardee, be extended for an additional 5-year period. School Board reserves the right to cancel the contract in the event the services rendered do not comply with the provisions of the proposal and/or the quality of services are deemed inadequate. The proposer must comply with all municipal, state and federal statutes prohibiting discrimination, including, but not limited to discrimination based on race, religion, ethnicity, national origin and gender.

The School Board reserves the right to cancel the contract in the event the services rendered do not comply with the provisions of the proposal and/or the quality of services is found to be undesirable, upon giving sixty (60) days written notice.

At the end of the term of the contract or upon notice of termination, the awarded proposer shall have thirty (30) workdays to remove any and all machines, enclosures and other materials associated with this program. This removal of equipment and its components shall be at no cost to the district.

IX. EVALUATION OF PROPOSALS

School District representatives will evaluate all proposals to identify the best leasing option most advantageous to the Board. The evaluation committee will include the following members or designees:

Representatives (2), Food and Nutrition

Senior High School Principal

Middle School Principal

Representative, Division of Business Development and Assistance

Representative(s), Procurement Management Services (non-voting)

Representative, Food Service Accounting

Representative, School Operations

Representative, Management and Compliance Audits (non-voting)

The evaluation committee will consider, but is not limited to examining, the following specific criteria:

- Proposer's ability to provide requisite items specified in the RFP;
- Proposer's expertise and experience with similar projects in similar environments;
- Proposer's stated lease arrangement;
- Estimated time frame for completion of implementation;
- Ability to accommodate M-DCPS district volume (schools, students, employees) and work within M-DCPS environment and culture.

The School Board reserves the right to reject any or all proposals, to further negotiate any proposals, to waive any irregularities or informalities, to accept or reject any items or combination of items, to request clarification of information submitted in any proposal and to request additional information from any proposer. Following the selection of a proposal and approval by the School Board, a professional services agreement acceptable to the School Board Attorney will be entered into with the successful proposer. Unsuccessful proposers will not receive additional information following the issuance of a final decision.

X. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY AND M/WBE PARTICIPATION

Equal Employment Opportunity

1. It is the policy of the School Board that no person will be denied access, employment, training, or promotion on the basis of gender, race, color,

religion, ethnic or national origin, political beliefs, marital status, age, sexual orientation, social and family background, linguistic preference or disability, and that merit principles will be followed.

Each firm is requested to indicate its equal employment policy and provide a detailed breakdown by ethnicity, gender and occupational categories of its work force. **(ATTACHMENT B)**

2. Minority/Women Business Enterprise (M/WBE) Participation

The School Board has an active Minority/Women Business Enterprise (M/WBE) Program, to increase contracting opportunities for M/WBE's. In keeping with this policy, if a minority firm, which is Woman or African American-owned and operated, is to perform a scope of work, provide documentation to substantiate the experience of the M/WBE and its staff in providing this type of service. XI. GENERAL INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Professional Liability

The Professional Liability Insurance provided by the individual/firm shall conform to the following requirements:

- A. The individual firm's Professional Liability insurance shall be on a form acceptable to the Board and shall cover those sources of liability typically insured by Professional Liability Insurance, arising out of or the rendering or failure to render professional services in the performance of this agreement, including all provisions of indemnification which is part of this agreement.
- B. The insurance shall be subject to a maximum deductible not to exceed \$25,000.
- C. If on a claims-made basis, the individual/firm shall maintain without interruption, the Professional Liability Insurance until (3) years after this agreement.
- D. The minimum limits to be maintained by the individual/firm (inclusive of any amounts provided by an umbrella or excess policy) shall be \$1 million per claim/annual aggregate.

Each insurance policy evidencing the insurance required hereunder shall bear the appropriate endorsements whereby the insurance carrier waives any rights of

subrogation acquired against the Board and the Students by reason of any payment under such policy and shall provide that such insurance carriers shall notify the Board in writing at least (30) days prior to any cancellation, termination, non-renewal or modification to the individual/firm's policy (ies) required under this agreement.

Upon the execution of this agreement, the individual/firm shall furnish to the Board's Office of Risk and Benefits Management with Certificates of Insurance evidencing the individual/firm's insurance coverage is consistent with the terms of the agreement. The individual/firm shall also provide copies of the policies to the Board. The individual/firm shall also provide the Board with renewal or replacement Certificates of Insurance no less than (30) days prior to cancellation, termination or modification. The individual/firm shall be in material breach of this agreement if the individual/firm fails to obtain replacement insurance coverage prior to the date in which coverage is terminated or expires. In this event the Board may terminate this agreement without further liability to the individual/firm. Additionally the individual/firm shall be liable to the Board for any and all damages incurred due to the individual/firm's failure to perform the agreement terms.

XII. INDEMNIFICATION

The individual/firm(s) must enter into the following indemnification and hold harmless agreement:

The individual/firm(s) hereby agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend the Board, its officers, agents and employees individually and collectively from and against all liabilities, obligations, losses, damages, penalties, interest, claims, actions, assessments, fines, suits, demands, investigations, proceedings, judgments, orders or injuries, including death to any, or damage, of whatever nature, to any property and all costs including court costs and attorneys' fees, and disbursements, whether suit is instituted or not, and if instituted, at all tribunal levels (wherever raised by the parties hereto or a third party) imposed on, or incurred by or asserted against the Board or any of them arising out of or in connection with or based directly or indirectly upon (a) the individual/firm's directors, officers, employees, agents, subcontractors or representatives, of their duties and obligations under or pursuant to this agreement, including without limitations, the failure to maintain insurance or notify the Board; (b) any material breach of this agreement by the individual/firm(s), (c) false or inaccurate representation or warranty made by or on behalf of the individual/firm(s), and (d) any act or omission, negligence, or intentional acts of the individual/firm(s), or any of the individual/firm's directors, officers, employees, agents, subcontractors or other representatives.

XIII. THE JESSICA LUNSFORD ACT BACKGROUND SCREENING REQUIREMENTS

In accordance with the requirements of sections 1012.32, 1012.465, and 435.04, Florida Statutes (2004) as well as with the requirements of HB 1877, The Jessica Lunsford Act (2005), effective September 1, 2005, Contractor agrees to certify under oath and penalty of perjury, see **ATTACHMENT C** (Sworn Statement Pursuant to Sections 1012.32, 1012.465, and 435.04, Florida Statutes (2004) and

HB 1877, The Jessica Lunsford Act (2005)) which is incorporated fully herein by reference, that Contractor and all of its employees who provide or may provide services under this Agreement have completed all background screening requirements as outlined in the above-referenced statutes.

Additionally, Contractor agrees that each of its employees, representatives, agents, subcontractors or suppliers who are permitted access on school grounds when students are present, who have direct contact with students or who have access to or control of school funds must meet level 2 screening requirements as described in sections 1012.32 and 435.04, Florida Statutes, and further upon obtaining level 2 clearance, must obtain a required Board issued photo identification badge which shall be worn by the individual at all times while on Board property when students are present.

Contractor agrees to bear any and all costs associated with acquiring the required background screening – including any costs associated with fingerprinting and obtaining the required photo identification badge. Contractor agrees to require all its affected employees to sign a statement, as a condition of employment with Contractor in relation to performance under this Agreement, agreeing that the employee will abide by the heretofore described background screening requirements, and also agreeing that the employee will notify the Contractor/Employer of any arrest(s) or conviction(s) of any offense enumerated in s. 435.04, Florida Statutes within 48 hours of its occurrence.

Contractor agrees to provide the Board with a list of all of its employees who have completed background screening as required by the above-referenced statutes and who meet the statutory requirements contained therein. Contractor agrees that it has an ongoing duty to maintain and update these lists as new employees are hired and in the event that any previously screened employee fails to meet the statutory standards. Contractor further agrees to notify the Board immediately upon becoming aware that one of its employees who was previously certified as completing the background check and meeting the statutory standards is subsequently arrested or convicted of any disqualifying offense. Failure by Contractor to notify the Board of such arrest or conviction within 48 hours of being put on notice and within 5 business days of the occurrence of a qualifying arrest or conviction shall constitute grounds for immediate termination of this Agreement by the Board.

The parties further agree that failure by Contractor to perform any of the duties described in this section shall constitute a material breach of the Agreement entitling the Board to terminate this Agreement immediately with no further responsibility to make payment or perform any other duties under this Agreement.

COMPLIANCE WITH SCHOOL CODE

Contractor agrees to comply with all sections of the Florida K-20 Education Code, Title XLVIII, Florida Statutes, as it presently exists, and further as it may be amended from time to time. Further Contractor agrees that failure to comply with the Florida K-20 Education Code shall constitute a material breach of this Agreement

and may result in the termination of this Agreement by the Board.

XIV. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Former Miami-Dade County Public Schools employees, classified as Managerial Exempt Personnel, Pay Grade 22 and above, Dade County School Administrators Association, Pay Grade 47 and above, and other equivalent positions, are prohibited from personally representing another person or entity or acting as an agent or attorney for compensation in connection with any matter in which The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, is interested, for two years after the School Board employees' service terminates. This provision is pursuant to School Board Rule 6Gx13 – 4A-1.212 and Florida Statute § 112.313(9).

The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida shall be prohibited from entering into any business relationship or continue an existing business relationship with any person or entity determined to have engaged in violation of the restriction contained in this provision.

XV. PUBLIC RECORDS LAW

It is the practice of The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, to evaluate all Requests For Proposals in a public forum open to the Sunshine, pursuant to Florida Statute §286.011, and to make available for public inspection and copying any information received in response to an RFP, in accordance with Florida Statute §119, as such, any information sent to M-DCPS is being sent into the public domain. No action on the part of the proposer would create an obligation of confidentiality on the part of the School Board, including but not limited to, making a reference in the proposal to the trade secret statutes, Florida Statutes §§ 812.081, 815.045. It is recommended that potential suppliers exclude from their response any information that, in their judgment, may be considered a trade secret.
