storm drain pump-out and repair services, for Maintenance Operations

Regulatory Compliance Division.

Comments:

The contract was approved as a Superintendent's Extension of Contracts, on

October 24, 2006. However, the extension amount of \$627,950 was incorrect.

This correction reflects a revised amount of \$686,869.60, as indicated above.

Justification: It is considered to be in the best interest of the District to extend this contract for an additional one (1) year period, at firm unit prices, to benefit from fixed prices. This contract requires multiple site visits by the vendors' work crew to perform service, thereby, increasing the vendors' cost of doing business, due to higher fuel

prices compared to the initial contract period.

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However, this cost increase will not be passed to the District, during the next contract term. Staff has indicated satisfactory performance from the vendors and recommends extension. Attempts were made to benchmark against Broward County Public Schools and Palm Beach County Public Schools contracts; however, the terms, conditions, structure, and line-item service requirements are not equal, so benchmarking is not comparatively feasible. This is the first extension of the contract. The awardees have agreed to extend for an additional one (1) year extension period, by letter, on file.
