

QUESTIONS AND RESPONSES FOR RFP NO. 038-FF10 - EXCLUSIVE BEVERAGE POURING RIGHTS FOR MIAMI-DADE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS VENDING PROGRAM AND 096-FF10 - SELF-OPERATED VENDING PROGRAM

The following questions and responses are being forwarded pursuant to the Pre-bid conference held on March 31, 2006.

QUESTION: How many snack, beverage and milk machines are presently placed in all of the locations and how many will be requested for this RFP?

RESPONSE: The District will be installing approximately the same number currently utilized for the senior high access fee program and the middle school sites will be determined after the award.

QUESTION: What are the sizes of the school doors and teacher lounge doors for the machines and cages that will go inside them?

RESPONSE: Standard sized doors. Proposers may visit any school to get the measurements, if necessary. No cages will be allowed.

QUESTION: How many banks of 1,2, and 3 machines do you want?

RESPONSE: The senior high schools will retain approximately the same number of machines. The middle schools will have to be determined after the award.

QUESTION: How many people will need to be trained and what are their capacities?

RESPONSE: At least three employees at each school site will need to be trained. The employees will be food service workers.

QUESTION: Can you describe more specifically the Marketing panels and the program itself?

RESPONSE: The vendor(s) selected for the exclusive beverage pouring rights will have the right to place marketing materials (with the approval of Food and Nutrition) on all vending machines under the control of Food and Nutrition. These machines will be located in the student-access areas only. They will be attached to the machines sides in some type of panel, etc.

QUESTION: How many timers do you want? What are the specifications on the timers?

RESPONSE: The timers are not a requirement for the vending machines.

QUESTION: Why isn't the School Board buying its own machines?

RESPONSE: The Department of Food and Nutrition would like a turnkey, all-inclusive operation, thereby avoiding any maintenance, repair, vandalism, etc.

QUESTION: Does the vending responsibilities for student access sites include other availability, such as lunch line and counter services?

RESPONSE: No.

QUESTION: Can you provide us with a listing of non-student access sites?

RESPONSE: Yes. Please refer to Addendum Number 2, which is posted on the website.

QUESTION: What is the timeline for non-student access since we have to meet with each location in order to determine the optimum number of machines?

RESPONSE: There is no specific timeline. This will be a phased-in process. The schedule will be coordinated with the awarded vendors. The District would like to proceed as soon as practical.

QUESTION: Would there be one delivery site for products or multiple locations?

RESPONSE: Multiple locations.

QUESTION: Define price increase indicator that the Procurement Management Services and Food and Nutrition would use to approve price increase.

RESPONSE: Prices increases may be submitted for consideration based upon the Consumer Price Index or other market indicators.

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QUESTION: What companies are excluded?

RESPONSE: No one is excluded.

QUESTION: If we were the successful vendor for vending machines, would there be a problem with us subcontracting the snack machines.

RESPONSE: Subcontracting is permitted, however, the District would hold the awarded contractor responsible for the performance of its subcontractors.

QUESTION: Describe expectations on security devices against theft for vending machines.

RESPONSE: Cages will not be allowed. The District will look at all devices, including a device to deter breaking into the money changer and other parts of the machine. Any type of deterrent will be evaluated.

QUESTION: Please explain generic vend fronts. Do you have a specific manufacturer in mind?

RESPONSE: The machines should be generic with no panels of marketing or advertising, but a method to install them for the awarded exclusive beverage vendor. No specific manufacturer has been identified.

QUESTION: What is the possibility of extending the opening date?

RESPONSE: The proposal opening date has been extended to Tuesday, May 9, 2006, no later than 2:00 p.m.

QUESTION: Does this RFP include ice cream vending machines?

RESPONSE: No. Ice cream vending will not be a part of the future vending plans for M-DCPS at this time. The District may decide at a later date to include ice cream sales; however it will be through the self-vending program.

QUESTION: Will the exclusive beverage vendor have access to the full service line?

RESPONSE: Food and Nutrition may consider adding non-carbonated or milk products provided by the selected exclusive beverage pouring rights vendor to the serving line, however other products will also be available. The products sold will not be exclusive on the line, only in the vending machines.

QUESTION: What is the enrollment for the middle and senior high schools?

RESPONSE: The approximate number of enrolled students is as follows:

Middle Schools = 86,902

Senior High Schools = 110,334

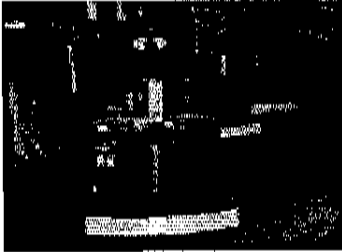

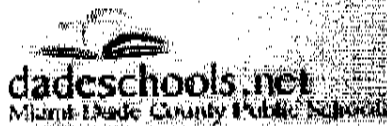
